Pastor: We begin the year of our Lord 2023 with worship and praise to His holy name, the name which was put upon each of us in our baptism.

Congregation: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Confession of Sins and God's Grace and Forgiveness

Pastor: It's a new year! For many of us, this is the first day of seeking to keep the resolutions we've made in hopes of changing the things which need to be changed about ourselves, or that we want to change about ourselves. It's also true that for many of us, we've already come up short on keeping our resolutions. But as we look back at our lives this past year, we can see more than broken resolutions. We can see broken commandments. We can see the times we've sinned against God and against each other. God invites us now to make a genuine confession of our sins. And as He invites us to confess, so He extends to us the gracious promise that He will forgive us of all our sins for the sake of His Son, Jesus.

Congregation: Heavenly Father, as I look at myself in the mirror of the Ten Commandments, I see my sins against You and against my neighbor. Sins of thoughts. Sins of words. Sins of deeds. Your Word tells me that even if I've only broken one of the Commandments, I then have broken them all. I am truly sorry that I have sinned against You. I am also truly grateful that You sent Your Son to suffer and die and pay the full price of my sin so that I might be forgiven. I ask Your forgiveness in His name. And I ask for the power and presence of Your Holy Spirit that I might leave behind my sinful ways and live a life of faith, bringing glory to Your holy name. Amen.

Pastor: In a few moments we will hear these words from Galatians 3: "For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ." To be clothed with Christ means His perfect life covers you from head to toe. It means that all of your sins have been washed away. It means you are forgiven and that you belong to Christ. Such is His promise. And in Jesus, all of God's promises have their "Amen."

Pastor: Heavenly Father, as we begin this new year, there are so many uncertainties that we face. Yet, we want to live lives of faith in You.

Congregation: So it is we pray that You will be our Shepherd...that You will guide us and lead us in paths of righteousness for Your name's sake. In the name of Jesus we pray. Amen.
