Now, while there are a whole bunch of thoughts running through my mind as I write this which I'd like to say, none of them bring us to the point I want to make with the exception of this one. Let's go fishing! As in, let's each be out there witnessing about Jesus, the risen Savior, with our words and with our lives to our families and our friends and our neighbors and our community!

To be sure, like disciples, we may not have immediate success. So, try the other side of the boat. Maybe that's to start praying for the person you know God is placing into your life so that you can witness to them. You've got to know that Jesus will answer those prayers, because after all, just as He wanted the disciples to catch some fish, so He wants us to catch those who don't know Him.

And really, when it comes right down to it. It was Jesus who was responsible for that great catch of fish He blessed the disciples with. So it will be Jesus who will be responsible for the great catch He blesses us with. After all, He's the one who knows where the fish are! And He knows how to catch them!


