Invocation (Isaiah 40:28-30)

Pastor: "Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God.

Congregation: He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak.

Pastor: Even young people grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall;

Congregation: But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not grow faint."

Pastor: We are here to renew our strength, to place our hope in the Lord as we worship in His name.

Congregation: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Confession and Forgiveness

Pastor: What makes us weary more than anything else is the burden of guilt we carry from the sins we have done. Our heavenly Father invites us to cast that burden upon His Son, for Jesus has taken our sins to the cross that we could be forgiven and renewed with the strength of His grace to live for Him. So God in His Word promises, "If we confess our sins, God will be faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness." We bring that burden of sin to Him now.

Congregation: Heavenly Father, I confess to You that I have sinned against You in more ways than I can count. I have broken Your commands with my thoughts and words and actions. I have offended You and am truly sorry for all the wrongs I have done. For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, I seek and ask for Your forgiveness. Wash me with His blood and create a clean heart in me that I may live in a way that brings You honor and glory and praise.

Pastor: Ten days ago our confirmation class studied Luke 15 and the 3 parables of the Lost Sheep, the Lost Coin, and the Lost Son. Though in the form of a complaint by the Pharisees and teachers of the law, this chapter of the Bible begins with these wonderful and comforting words regarding Jesus. "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." (Luke 15:2) Jesus went on to tell the first two parables, ending them both with these words of grace and forgiveness for sinners who have repented of their sins: "I tell you that in the same way there is rejoicing in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents." (Luke 15:10) So I announce to you now that heaven is rejoicing over you and your repentance. For in the stead and at the command of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ I tell you that all of your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Congregation: Amen.**
