Easter is the Cruelest Season

April is the cruelest month, breeding Lilacs out of the dead land, mixing Memory and desire, stirring Dull roots with spring rain.

T.S. Eliot begins his 1922 poem, *The Wasteland*, with these words. After living in Minnesota for a few years, I joke that April can be the cruelest month because sometimes it teases us with warm weather, and then hits us with a snowstorm.

However, Eliot says April is the cruelest of all the months, not based on the weather, but the fact that lilacs burst forth from the ground and bloom with the new life given to them. He's saying "How dare that lily burst forth from the ground and produce new life." This is a lament for how winter causes all things to die and if anything, seems like the natural state of our lives. But this wasteland turns out to be a garden as new life springs up.

This might seem strange for someone to complain about spring. But I can understand this. There are moments in our lives where things seem bleak. This last 12 months have created a number of problems people have had. As many families are struggling financially, emotionally, and physically, it almost seems out of place for hope to break into our lives.

However, not only does the lilac bloom in the spring whether we want it to or not, so does God break into our world with Easter. Easter is the reality that in a lifeless and broken world, Christ came into our midst. Life was full of heartbreak, famines, pandemics, and suffering of all kinds, and it was into this world that Christ came.

On the cross, he entered into suffering for us, and he could not stay dead. Our God is not a God of the wastelands, but of the garden where the tomb was. Jesus could not stay dead, but he had to rise because he has mastery over all of creation, including pandemics, depression, suffering and even death itself. That's why we are bold to proclaim this year the words of Paul:

1 Corinthians 15:54 When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory."

⁵⁵ *"Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?"*

This is because we don't live in a wasteland, but in a world where not only flowers burst forth from the ground in spring, but even the dead are raised to a new life. I say this as encouragement for you if you've had a difficult year, that you can still know the victory God has given you!

Pending Approval Minutes March 18, 2021

Pastor opened with prayer; Mission Statement was read by Kyle.

Bible Study: 1 Corinthians 8 was read and discussed

Treasurer's Report was read by Ron. There is a concern that the offering income has been less then we need to meet our weekly budget. The good news is that expenses have also been less than expected. Deb made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report, seconded by Joanny, motion passed.

Properties Report was given by Keith: The drain field was frozen during the cold snap, it was pumped out. A few days later the middle bathrooms overflowed. Carpets got wet. It was cleaned up. Carpets are scheduled to be cleaned in fellowship hall and sanctuary next week. Other properties needing attention are shelves for quilters and the table and chairs in hospitality room are stained beyond cleaning. Joanny

made motion to accept the report, Keith seconded it, and the motion passed.

Secretary's Report was reviewed. Ron made motion to accept the report as printed, Dave seconded it. Motion passed

Pastoral Activity Report: The Daddy Daughter Dance was a success with 40-45 elementary age girls attending with Dad or Grandfather. Pastor feels it is worth doing again next year, possibly annually.

Attendance at Sunday Services has increased the last couple weeks from 40 to 70. In addition to Sunday services, Pastor has been doing midweek Lenten Services. These have had strong attendance in past years when we have been able to host a meal before the services, but this year with no meal and Covid limitations, attendance has been slim.

Pastor's other activities included 2 Wednesday evening Confirmation classes, regular meetings with Julie and BOLM and Circuit Meeting.

Pastors are still not allowed to visit shut-ins in facilities or hospitals. He makes phone calls to 8 or 9 people regularly, but it is just not as effective as in-person ministry.

Main Street Living aired Pastor David's sermon "God's Workmanship" on Sunday, March 14. It was well worth watching.

Because of the generosity of the village to us, Pastor Dave says it feels good to be able to be generous with Bridge Church. Kyle relayed that Bridge intends to go back to their purchased land this summer.

New Business:

Covid Update: In the Governor's latest changes Churches no longer have restrictions to the number of people allowed to attend. Many have received Vaccines and are returning to church. Guidelines are still being followed and we all have a new awareness to safety. Members are encouraged to attend and to extend grace to each other as we readjust to being together after such a long time of strict regulations. We are reminded that due to HIPPA and the 4th Amendment, others cannot legally ask about any condition that would prevent someone from wearing a mask or being Vaccinated. As a church we cannot require people to have the vaccine.

Worship Shepherd Schedule: Bev and Ron may switch places on the schedule and will report changes to Julie.

Next BOLM Meeting: Thursday, April 15,2021 at 7:00 P.M.

Leaders Comments: It was suggested that we stop reading the Mission Statement before each meeting and that we eliminate reading the Bible Chapter to save time. Discussion included the opinion that the Board of Lay Ministry Meeting is part of the Ministry of our church and it is good to keep our Mission in mind even while doing business. The Bible reading could take place during the Prayer time before the meeting.

Joanny and Pastor mentioned church is beginning to implement back toward normal for Communion and Children's Message. They are working out how this can be done safely.

Dave made motion to **adjourn the meeting**, Ron seconded it and motion carried.

Greetings to all!

We wanted to give you an update on VBS 2021! It is scheduled for June 6-10 for children age 4-5th grade. If your child is 4 yrs old through the completion of 5th grade 2021 we look forward to seeing you! There are a couple requests we ask of the parents. First, we are asking for as much pre-registration as possible so we can see the numbers we are looking at. We have enough to facilitate 125 children so we will go on a first come first serve basis. Second, Covid has caused a lot of issues and church numbers are down all around so that means volunteers are also down. We need 50 volunteers to make this a success for a safe, smooth flowing time, PLEASE volunteer!!! The spots are : **Being a guide** = leading a group of 5-6 children to the different stations each night (5 total) and helping them to have the best time at each station; Being the **person to lead the craft area** = 5 groups come to you each night and you explain the craft, help them to construct it, and tell them how it pertains to each nights theme ; The Bible Story teller = you share God's word with each group in your own "theater" each night; Kitchen = if you are handy with snacks and attentive to allergies, we NEED you in the kitchen! Each night the children get a snack (simple one) on individual serving. We do have or have had children that need close allergy attention, which means they get served a different snack allergy free. We know this beforehand, it is just to not contaminate their food and get it to them when they come to snack time.; **Preschool (4 yr old) room helper** = Assist the preschool; **Games**!!! Each night you lead the each group in a game (fun!) and relate it to the nightly theme! Each station has the night already done, you just follow the book! PLEASE consider volunteering, without volunteers we cannot have VBS!!!! Let's give the children a week of the Holy Spirit filled with laughter, fun, food, that we ALL so need!!! 


