

A Mighty Fortress Is Our God

When facing the unprecedented COVID-19 pandemic, it's easy to feel alone and unsure. Never before has a virus shut down the entire. While this has never happened before, I find comfort in understanding that Christians throughout history have dealt with difficulties and afflictions.

If you were raised in the Lutheran Church, you might know the hymn "A Mighty Fortress is Our God." It's usually sung on Reformation Sunday with the focus being the persistence of the Gospel against Satan's attacks. However, I recently found out that Luther's personal struggles reveal a deeper meaning.

It's believed that Luther wrote this hymn from 1527-28. In the fall of 1527, a plague broke out in Wittenberg, where Luther lived. Most of the town was shut down and many moved to the country to get away from the plague. Luther stayed in Wittenberg and was willing to continue preaching God's Word and administering the sacraments to God's people, even if it meant that he was to die of the plague.

In December 1527, Luther had a daughter, Elizabeth, born sickly. In May of 1528, she died. Luther spent a great amount of time asking God to heal his sick newborn girl. For reasons we are unable to understand, God chose not to heal her. Luther writes at this time that he was spiritually and emotionally exhausted. The long nights of prayer and suffering never ceased.

It was at this time Luther was writing "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God." Read through the last stanza with this in mind.

God's Word forever shall abide, No thanks to foes, who fear it; For God Himself fights by our side With weapons of the Spirit. Were they to take our house, Goods, honor, child, or spouse, Though life be wrenched away, They cannot win the day. The Kingdom's ours forever!

While our present circumstances are unique, I find encouragement in the struggles and faith Christians have had. For some, this COVID pandemic has brought afflictions that are too much to bear. If this is you, find comfort in what God continues to do for you. This pandemic, just like many other "devils' afflicting us, is indeed too much for us to bear. But we have Christ who fights for us and promises to be close to each of us.

Pending Approval Minutes – May 21, 2020

BOLM members present via Zoom meeting: Sarah Anderson, Kyle Hackett, Bev Gerads, Keith Peterson, Pastor David Edge, Dave Perleberg, Curt Kvamme, Deb Erdman Absent: Wayne Peterson, Wayne Anderson Meeting was called to order by at 7:05 pm and opened with prayer. The mission statement was read by Kyle.

Treasurer's Report – April income was \$17,327.43 and expenses were \$19,669.52. Curt applied for and received a \$29,100 SBA loan from Bremer Bank which was received in April. Deb made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report and Sarah seconded. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report – Deb made a motion to accept the Secretary's report as written, seconded by Dave. Motion carried.

Pastoral Activity Report – Pastor David reported on his activities in the month of April while the stay at home continued. He has been using the analytics available to see how often the videos for service and children's message are used. Pastor David will be on vacation June 22 through July 3 with Pastor John Beck from Messiah in Sartell will fill in.

Old Business

Policy Binders – This topic was tabled to our next in person meeting.

Early Communion is postponed.

Confirmation Date – Reformation in late fall may be a good time to hold our Confirmation Service.

VBS – We are waiting for guidelines from the state to be released to decide when to have VBS.

New Members – Two new families are interested in joining. Pastor will schedule this with them when in person meetings are reasonable.

New Business

The worship shepherd schedule was reviewed through July 19th. Next BOLM meeting will be on June 18th at 7pm with praise and prayer at 6:30pm God willing.

Properties – Keith reported that the parking lot has been swept. Keith and Pastor ran a wire for a live feed to a monitor in the fellowship hall for sanctuary overflow. Spring lawn work is complete. He will review some small projects with the committee when group meetings are allowed again.

Copier Proposal – Julie and Pastor presented the options we have. Going with Metro in September will be the most economical option for our office. Our current lease ends in October. A lease through Metro would be 60 months long. Our current copier has a tiered schedule of costs based on the number of copies made. Metro copies are priced based on color or black & white. Motion was made by Bev to change to Metro Sales for copier service in September seconded by Deb. Motion carried.

Marriage Night – SOTP will be hosting a Right Now Media presentation. Couples can register for \$30.00. Right Now Media will refund half of the registration money to the church for hosting this presentation. Suggested date is September 12th (live stream at 6:30pm) or later in the month. This topic was tabled to our next meeting to decide on a definite date.

Quilters – Request to leave tables set up to encourage people to come in and work on quilts as time allows. The BOLM talked about the request and decided it will be granted for the summer months. Keith is available for set up if needed.

Return to Worship plans – Julie shared the MN Governor's phases for returning to Worship. Pastor David and Julie had prepared guidelines from the synod and reached out to the city and county regarding our church services. The BOLM discussed the preparations and the timing of opening, given the Governor's latest

guidance. Sarah made a motion to open SOTP for worship on May 31st, Kurt seconded. Motion carried. Pastor David, Julie, Wayne Peterson and Bev will work on the safety protocols.

Motion was made to adjourn the meeting by Bev, seconded by Deb. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 9:39 pm. Meeting was closed with prayer.

Shepherd of the Pines Protocols for Beginning Onsite Worship Services During Covid-19 Crisis APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF THE LAY MINISTRY

MAY 26, 2020

We believe Worship services and other celebrations are essential (e.g. baptisms, weddings, and funerals) Also, small group studies and support meetings would be allowed. We want to remind you that if you are feeling sick or you are concerned to stay home as Online Worship Services will still be available.

We feel that we can open safely and follow guidelines to manage the risk for the spread of the virus.

- One Worship Service 9am Sunday Morning.
- Please complete the questionnaire before you come on the next page.
- ✤ The doors will be propped open on Sunday morning.
- ✤ We ask that you do not greet each other by touching.
- Hand sanitizer will be available outside before walking into church as well inside church in 3 areas (wall outside of sanctuary, inside the sanctuary, and in the fellowship hall by the kitchen door). There will also be hand sanitizer in the musician area and the projection area.
- We will not have paper bulletins. We will have everything available on the screen. Also, we will have our announcements on the website, and they are emailed out each Friday.
- Chairs every other row will be removed. The rows that are left we ask member to have 4 empty chairs between each family.
- We will have the fellowship hall set up and available for extra spacing. The TV in the Fellowship Hall will have the same slides as the projector in the sanctuary.
- P Quiet bags have been removed, you are welcome to bring items from home to occupy your children
- Window and doors will be open when weather permits to help with ventilation. (NO Ceiling fans)
- ✤ We will put signs on the door about following social distance, washing hands or using sanitizer.
- Adults will temporarily be required to wear a face mask. We have some cloth available as well as disposable ones. You will be asked to leave if you choose not to follow this.
- ✤ An offering plate will be set up on a stand and not passed around.
- For communion, we have prefilled individual cups with wafers. Gluten free is also available. Pastor will wear gloves and pass them out before service. We will do communion as a group at the end of service.
- Choir will not be meeting or preforming until the fall.
- Signs and other instructions will encourage normal safe practices necessary to stop the spread (e.g. cough or sneeze into a shirtsleeve, handkerchief, or tissue; avoid touching the eyes, nose, and mouth to help slow the spread of germs).
- Bibles have been removed. We ask you to bring your own or just follow along on the screen.
- We will do Prayer and anointing with oil on the 5th Sunday of the month. We ask that if you choose to participate, you social distance and Pastor David will change gloves after each person.
- ✤ We ask that one family uses the restroom facilities at a time.
- The sanctuary and fellow ship hall will be cleaned and sanitized after each service.

We're here for you. Our church recognizes some of these measures are inconvenient. These recommendations are adapted from the Minnesota Department of Health as well as the Minnesota North District - Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. These precautions are temporary for this conditional opening and we're looking forward to a full unrestrictive opening of our church in the near future.

We understand that not everyone will want to come back to church right away. If you're more vulnerable to the virus or if you have any of the symptoms listed above we ask that you stay home. Likewise, if you're not ready to come back to church until some of these restrictions have been lifted, we also understand that.

Our Board of Lay Ministry has labored over these protocols. Our meetings have gone through different people's perspectives and inputs on these points. If you feel strongly on any of these protocols, I want you to know:

- First, we value the safety of all of our members, especially the most vulnerable.
- Second, if you would like to talk with me over any of these points, I welcome your feedback. Our Board and I are here to serve this congregation so we want to know how best to serve you within the new restrictions the pandemic has put us in.

None of us have ever been in a situation like this so I ask for your grace as our leaders and I work to reopen our church. We're probably not going to get everything right the first Sunday so these protocols will be adjusted as the needs of our church changes and as the information on COVID changes. I look forward to seeing you back in person on Sundays and if you would like to contact us regarding our reopening, feel free to contact me (Pastor David) or you can email Kyle Hackett, our church's president. 
